

I told him it was a mistake to tell me that! I am delighted that Ray Cook has offered his services at Down Ampney and Driffield; and for special services (Weddings and Funerals). Ray is keen to start a community choir, which – if we can get it going – will meet in Down Ampney. If you would like to join a new choir (no singing experience required) do let me know and I will invite you to our initial meeting.

Singing is good for us – mentally, physically and socially. We already have a small choir that sings on a Sunday at our services. Not only are they a choir – but friends with a common interest; and its wonderful how they welcome people into their group. And it's great to be part of it.

Locally, our churches are really inclusive and – I hope – welcoming. You are welcome on a Sunday; you are welcome to come and sing; you are welcome to come and enjoy the beauty of our buildings; you are welcome to use (or develop) your artistic skills with flower arranging; you are welcome to learn how to ring the bells; you are welcome to come and make some new friends. And you are welcome to simply come and be.

A recent member of our congregation has told me that she was really scared to cross the threshold of our church (and yes, it can feel daunting the first time); but it was the best thing she has done in years!

One of Jesus's disciples, Philip, told his friend Nathaniel – 'Come and see'. At this time of new beginnings and a new season, if you are looking for a new beginning in some way, why not 'come and see' us – you will be very welcome.
